

# ST JOSEPH PARISH NEWSLETTER MARCH 2005

## DEAR PARISHIONERS,

In October and November, approximately 75-100 school parents met with me either individually or as a group about concerns relating to our school. After consulting with the Archdiocesan School Office, I decided to survey our parents. In this survey, the parents were able to rank various aspects of the school and comment on what makes St. Joseph a great school and where they would like to see improvement.

About 400 parental surveys were returned (80%) and 55 faculty/staff surveys were returned. The parental and faculty/staff response to the survey was phenomenal. I found the written comments by the parents and faculty/staff to be extremely informative and direct.

Generally speaking, there is a high level of satisfaction with our school. Parents are proud to send their children to our school. But at the same time, parents, faculty and staff have mentioned areas of concern. The school parents and faculty seem to be divided in regard to being supportive of certain policies and personnel.

In the primary grades (K-3), there is a high degree of satisfaction with few exceptions. These parents are happy with the religious training, the academics, the curriculum, and the teachers. In the middle and upper grades (4<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup>) there is a greater degree of dissatisfaction. The fourth grade is always a difficult year because it is a year of transition and it takes a while for the children to adjust. While there are issues that need to be addressed in the middle and upper grades, the students in these grades are still receiving a quality education under the auspices of some very dedicated and qualified teachers.

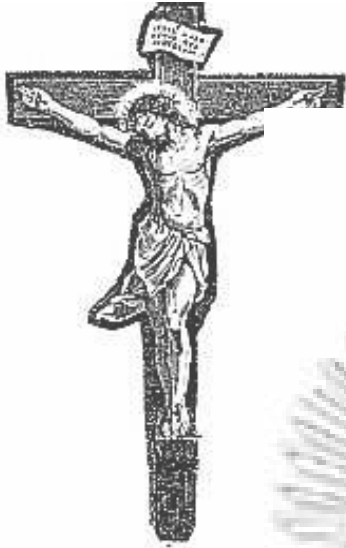
In January, I met with the administration, faculty and parents and explained in detail the results of the survey and shared with them some of my specific and measurable goals for the school. Some of those goals are: an Improvement Committee consisting of parents and teachers under the guidance of the School Board; a Task Force to review various rules and minor infractions and the inconsistencies of the application of these rules; review the transition for our 4<sup>th</sup> graders and make recommendations; seminars will be given to our faculty on stress management, motivation and sensitivity to students with ADD or ADHD; and I will be meeting personally with some of our teachers.

There is no doubt in my mind that St. Joseph Parish School is a quality school. The results prove it. Many of our graduates attend some of the more academically challenging Catholic high schools in the Archdiocese of St. Louis. The principals of those schools tell us that our students are indeed prepared for high school. The Holy Father has also granted a plenary indulgence for "The Year of The Eucharist" A Plenary Indulgence is granted to all faithful and to each individual faithful under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer in keeping with the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff, with the soul completely removed from attachment to any form of sin), each and every time they participate attentively and piously in a sacred function or a devotional exercise undertaken in honor of The Blessed Sacrament, solemnly exposed and conserved in the tabernacle.

Let us take advantage of the many graces and blessings that are waiting for us. Our Chapel hours are from Monday at 7:00 a.m. through Saturday at 4:00 p.m.

## REGISTRATION SCHEDULE FOR THE 2005/2006 SCHOOL YEAR:

**March 3 – Kindergarten Tours** – 1:30pm. and 6pm. Please call 441-0055, ext. 200, to make reservations for the evening tour. Day tours need no reservations.

**March 4 – Kindergarten Tour** – 9am.

**March 11** – Applications for new kindergarten through 8<sup>th</sup> grade students –

Applications will be accepted on this date for all grade levels from 8 to 10am. and 2 to 6pm. in the school cafeteria. No application will be finalized until all steps have been completed. This process is not on a first come-first served basis. If all necessary documentation is provided, the process should only take a short time.

This is a three-part process:

1. Submission of the application to St. Joseph School with all documentation.
  - a. Copy (for school's files) of Birth Certificate
  - b. Copy (for school's files) of Baptismal Certificate
  - c. Social Security Number
  - d. \$200.00 Application Fee (non-refundable)– per student
  - e. Signed release for records from previous school and a copy (for school's files) of the last report card.
2. Student academic assessment testing for grade level.
3. Interview with the assistant principal (parent and student).

The criteria for admission in St. Joseph School is as follows:

Families applying to St. Joseph Catholic School must demonstrate to the Administration (pastor/principal) a desire for the special kind of school where Catholic teaching and moral formation are an integral part of the school philosophy and environment. This includes:

- a. Participation in the spiritual and community life of the parish or respective congregations.
- b. Support of the concepts upheld in the Parish Witness Statement.
- c. Agreement and willingness to follow the policies and procedures of St. Joseph School and the Archdiocese of St. Louis.
- d. Willingness to financially support the Parish/school.
- e. Willingness to cooperate with the teachers and administration in the moral, psychological, emotional, spiritual, intellectual and academic development of their children.
- f. For admission into kindergarten, children must be 5 years of age by August 1, 2005.

For admission into first grade, children must be 6 years of age by August 1, 2005.

The Principal will place the student in a class according to his/her level of achievement and needs. Admission and grade placement will be determined by the results of screening tests, standardized achievement scores, report card, and records from the previous schools attended and by the school's ability to meet student's needs. If there are more qualified applicants than openings available, a waiting list will be formed.

**March 21-22-23** – New Kindergarten Screenings – Appointment times will be assigned at the time of application. No screening appointments will be given to incomplete applications.



## SEASONAL ALLERGIES

When you think of the approach of spring, do you imagine long walks outdoors, working in the garden, and opening up the windows to feel the warm breeze or do you start to sneeze, sniffle, and rub your bloodshot eyes at the thought of your allergies kicking in?

Thirty five-million Americans suffer from some form of seasonal allergies. "Allergies are caused when your immune system is triggered into action by things like pollen and mold, to which some people are sensitive." Allergy symptoms are greatly affected by the weather conditions. Hot, dry, and windy weather can increase symptoms because the pollen and mold are more readily blown about.

Some of the symptoms of seasonal allergies are runny-nose, sore and itchy throat, itchy eyes, wheezing, coughing, fatigue, and headache. If you are suffering from any or all of these symptoms and you've noticed that the symptoms occur at the same time every year or that they last longer than a cold, you are most likely suffering from allergies. See your physician to be sure of the diagnosis.

Allergy treatment begins with trying to avoid the substance to which you are allergic. If this doesn't work, your physician may suggest over-the-counter medicine or prescription medicine. If medication is not effective, you may want to consider allergy shots.

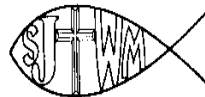
Here are some tips to help reduce your allergy problems:

- Keep your windows closed at home and in your car.
- Stay indoors when the pollen count is high and on windy days when dust and pollen are blown about.
- Take allergy medications regularly and in the prescribed dosages.
- If you are allergic to mold, don't grow too many, or over-water, indoor houseplants.
- Don't mow lawns, rake leaves, or be around freshly cut grass.
- Take a shower after being outside. Pollen can collect on your clothing, skin, and hair.

FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment will be conducting the financial need analysis for St. Joseph School for the upcoming 2005-2006 school year. Families applying for financial aid will need to complete an application and submit the necessary supporting documentation to FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment by April 1, 2005. FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment will provide a self-addressed envelope for you to mail the following information:

1. **Signed and completed paper application.**
2. **Payment of the \$20 application fee.**
3. **Copies of your most recent tax forms including all supporting tax schedules.**
4. **Copies of your 2004 W-2 form for both you and your spouse.**
5. **Copies of supporting documentation for Social Security Income, Welfare, Child Support, Food Stamps, Workers' Compensation, and TANF.**


Jesus, help us to commit ourselves to be good stewards of the gifts entrusted to us, to share our time, our talent, and our treasure as an outward sign of our love.
